# 1. Deported Foreigners



# In News:

Between April 1, 2023, and March 31, 2024, a total of **2,331 foreigners were deported** from India by the **Foreigners Regional Registration Officers (FRROs).** 

Top Countries of Origin for Deportees:

Nigeria: 1,470 deportations

Bangladesh: 411 deportations

Uganda: 78 deportations

Foreign Visitors to India (2023-24):

- Total Visitors: 98 lakh foreigners visited India during this period.

# 2. DG CRPF





- New Appointment: Gyanendra Pratap Singh appointed as Director General (D-G) of the Central Reserve Police Force (CRPF), replacing Vitul Kumar.
- Approval: Appointment cleared by the Appointments Committee of the Cabinet.



# 3. Scorpion Class (Project 75)



### In News:

- Indian Navy is set to commission three major platforms:
  - Vagsheer Sixth and last Scorpene-class submarine.
  - Surat Fourth and last Project-15B stealth destroyer.
  - Nilgiri Lead ship of the Project-17A stealth frigates.

This commissioning marks a **historic milestone** in India's naval capability. It showcases **rapid progress** in indigenous warship design and construction. Reinforces **India's position as a global leader in defense manufacturing**.

# Project 75 (P-75)

- One of two submarine construction lines under India's 1999 plan for **indigenous submarine building**; the other line is **P-75I**.
- Involves technology transfer from French company Naval Group (formerly DCNS) to Mazagon Dock Limited (MDL).
- Aimed at building advanced submarines in India with overseas expertise.

### **Submarines under P-75:**

- Commissioned: INS Kalvari, INS Khanderi, INS Karanj, INS Vela, INS Vagir.
- Vagsheer: Sixth and last submarine of the P-75 series.
  - Named after **sand fish**, a deep-sea predator of the Indian Ocean.

# Features of Vagsheer:

- Type: Diesel-electric attack submarine.
- Role: Sea denial and access denial warfare against adversaries.



- Equipped with a C303 anti-torpedo countermeasure system.
- Armament:

Up to 18 torpedoes or Exocet anti-ship missiles.

Option to carry 30 mines in place of torpedoes.

# Stealth capabilities:

- Advanced acoustic absorption techniques.
- Low radiated noise levels.
   Hydro-dynamically optimized shape.
- Can launch **precision-guided weapons** for crippling attacks **underwater or on surface**.

# 4. Nitrate Contamination



### In News:


Excessive Nitrate in Groundwater (India, 2023):

- 440 districts report excessive nitrate levels in groundwater (↑ from 359 districts in 2017).
- Health Hazard: Particularly dangerous for young children; contributes to environmental toxicity.
- Extent: 56% of India's districts have nitrate levels exceeding 45 mg/liter (safe limit).
- Regions: Rajasthan, Karnataka, and Tamil Nadu reported the highest levels of nitrate contamination, with 49%, 48%, and 37%, respectively, of their samples exceeding safe limits.



- Influence of Monsoon on Nitrate(NO3-) Levels: Monsoon rain increases nitrate levels in groundwater, with 30.77% of samples being contaminated before the monsoon and 32.66% after the rainy season.
- Concern: High nitrate levels in drinking water are associated with methemoglobinemia or "blue baby syndrome," a condition that affects the ability of blood to carry oxygen.

# 5. UDISE+ Report



### In News:

- Total Student Enrollment (2023-24): 24.8 crore.
- Change from 2018-19: Decrease of 1.22 crore students (6% decline). (both boys & Girls)
- States like Bihar, Uttar Pradesh, and Maharashtra saw significant drops in enrollment:
- Source: Unified District Information System for Education Plus (UDISE+) report by the Ministry of Education.
- **System Coverage:** Records data from **60+ fields** for each student.
- Aadhaar Numbers: Collected voluntarily for identification purposes.

# **UDISE+ System Enhancements::**

- Unique Educational ID (EID): Created for every student to track and verify student and teacher credentials.
- Purpose:
  - Prevent duplicate or ghost entries.
  - Ensure accurate identification for government benefit transfers.

- Event: 98th Conference and Concerts Sadas of The Music Academy, Chennai.
- Recognition: Honored for attracting younger audiences to Carnatic music.

- Manu Bhaker Double Olympic medallist shooter.
- **D. Gukesh** World Chess Champion.

- Praveen Kumar Paralympic Gold Medallist.

Usually Khel Ratna conferred upon **only one sportsperson in a year**, a few exceptions have been made (1993–1994, 2002, 2009, 2012, 2016–2021 and 2024) when multiple recipients were awarded in a year.



# 8. New Counties





### In News:

- China's Move: Declared formation of two new counties He'an County and Hekang County in Hotan prefecture, Xinjiang, which includes parts of Aksai Chin.
- India's Stand: Considers Aksai Chin as its territory, illegally occupied by China.
- **Diplomatic Response:** India lodged a "solemn protest" with China through diplomatic channels.
- Reaffirmation: India reiterated its sovereignty over the area.

# 1. Aksai Chin Dispute (Ladakh)

- Location: Northern part of Ladakh, northwestern India.
- India's Claim: Part of Jammu & Kashmir (now split into Union Territories of Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh).
- **Chinese Control:** Under China's control since the **1962 Sino-Indian War**; China considers it part of its **Xinjiang** region.
- Strategic Importance: Provides China a land link between Tibet and Xinjiang.
- Dispute Origin:
  - Boundaries between British India and China were not clearly demarcated in the early 20th century.
  - McMahon Line, recognized by India, does not extend into Aksai Chin, leading to conflicting claims.

# 9. AppointmentDGCA Chief






### In News:

- Faiz Ahmed Kidwai (IAS, 1996 batch, MP cadre) appointed Director-General of DGCA, replacing
   Vikram Dev Dutt.
- Tasked with addressing airline—pilot disputes over new 2024 rules: weekly rest increased from 36 to 48 hours and night flying restrictions to tackle pilot fatigue.

# 10. Indus Valley Civilization



- Announcement: Tamil Nadu CM M.K. Stalin declared a \$1-million prize for experts or organizations that can successfully decipher the Indus Valley Civilization scripts.
- Occasion: Made during an event in Chennai marking the centenary of the Indus Valley Civilization's discovery by Sir John Marshall.



# **Key Features of the Indus Valley Civilization**

- Urban Planning: Cities like Harappa and Mohenjo-Daro had a grid layout, advanced drainage systems,
   and public baths.
- Architecture: Standardized baked bricks; uniform weights and measures aided construction and trade
- **Economy:** Agriculture-based (**wheat, barley, cotton**); evidence of long-distance trade with Mesopotamia and other regions.
- Craftsmanship: Skilled artisans produced jewelry, pottery, and steatite seals.
- Writing System: Script remains undeciphered; inscriptions mainly found on seals.
- Religion: Polytheistic beliefs with fertility symbols and possible proto-Shiva worship.

# 11. Cowpea seeds



In News:



- Cowpea seeds sent into orbit by an ISRO mission have successfully germinated and produced their first leaves.
- The achievement was made through **VSSC's CROPS** (Compact Research Module for Orbital Plant Studies) aboard the **PSLV-C60 POEM-4** mission.
- It originated and domesticated in **southern Africa** and was later translocated to eastern and western Africa and Asia.
- It is also known as **black-eyed pea**, southern pea, etc.
- In the Indian context, it is a minor pulse grown mainly in the arid and semi-arid regions of Punjab, Haryana, Delhi, and West UP, along with significant areas in Rajasthan, Karnataka, Kerala, Tamilnadu, Maharashtra, and Gujarat.


# 12. Bharatpol portal

 Appointment: Mo Farah named International Event Ambassador for the 20th Tata Mumbai Marathon.


**About Mo Farah:** Somalia-born British athlete; winner of **10 global championship gold medals**, including **four Olympic golds** (5,000m & 10,000m).

# 16. Z-Morh tunnel

### In News - Z-Morh Tunnel



- Inauguration: Prime Minister Narendra Modi to inaugurate the Z-Morh Tunnel on January 13.
- Purpose: Part of a year-round strategic corridor connecting Kashmir and Ladakh.

# **Location & Strategic Importance:**

- Situated in Ganderbal district, Jammu & Kashmir.

- Prevents disruptions from **snowfall** and **avalanches** during winter.


# 17. 106th Amendment

- Case: Supreme Court dismissed petitions (filed in 2023) challenging provisions of the Women's Reservation Law.
- Law's Provision: Mandates 33% reservation for women in the Lok Sabha, State Legislatures, and Delhi Legislative Assembly.



Reason for Dismissal: Petitions deemed infructuous as the Women's Reservation Bill was already
enacted under the Constitution (106th Amendment) Act in September 2023.

# **18. NBWL**



# In News:

- Approval: The Standing Committee of the National Board for Wildlife (NBWL) cleared Vedanta Group's Cairn Oil and Gas proposal for oil and gas exploration.
- Location: Near Hoollongapar Gibbon Wildlife Sanctuary, Jorhat district, Assam.
- Recommendation: Clearance supported by Assam's Principal Chief Conservator of Forests (Wildlife) and Chief Wildlife Warden, citing "national interest."

# Basics:

The National Board for Wildlife (NBWL) is a **statutory body** in India that advises the government on wildlife conservation and protection efforts under the **Wildlife Protection Act, 1972.** 


# **Composition:**

- Prime Minister: Chairperson.
- Union Environment Minister: Vice-Chairperson.
- **Ex-Officio Members**: Includes senior officials from government ministries, states, and union territories.



• **Non-Official Members**: Includes wildlife experts, ecologists, environmentalists, and representatives from NGOs.

# 19. Integrated Guided Missile Development Program



### In News:

- Developer: Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO).
- Weapon: Nag Mk-2 indigenously developed, third-generation, fire-and-forget anti-tank guided missile.
- Trials: Recently conducted at Pokhran Field Range.
- Result: Successfully destroyed all targets with precision at both maximum and minimum ranges.
- Status: Ready for induction into the Indian Army.

# The 5 missiles (P-A-T-N-A) developed under this program are:

- **Prithvi**: Short range **surface to surface** ballistic missile.
- Agni: Ballistic missiles with different ranges, i.e. Agni (1,2,3,4,5)
- Trishul: Short range low level surface to air missile.
- Nag: 3rd generation anti-tank missile.
- Akash: Medium range surface to air missile.



# 20. SpaDex (PIB & TH)



### In News:

- ISRO Achievement: Successfully conducted a satellite docking experiment on Thursday.
- Global Ranking: India became the fourth country to achieve this milestone, after the U.S., Russia, and China.
- Satellites Involved: SDX01 (Chaser) and SDX02 (Target).
- Launch Details: Both satellites were launched by PSLV C60 on December 30.
- Post-Docking Control: ISRO operated the two docked satellites as a single object.

# **Key Information:**

- **Future Readiness:** The docking experiment showcases ISRO's preparation for upcoming projects, especially the **Bharatiya Antariksh Station (BAS)** planned for later this decade.
- **Technological Significance:** Docking technology supports **cost-effective** and **modular** space exploration, aligning with global trends.
- **Leadership:** Under new chairman **V. Narayanan**, ISRO is focusing on a coherent vision, particularly for BAS.
- Need for Clarity: BAS's specific role and utility should be clearly defined to match global space exploration goals.

# In News:

- App Launch: Bharat Ranbhoomi Darshan app introduced to let civilians visit battlefield locations along India's borders.
- Launch Date & Occasion: Released on January 15 by Defence Minister Rajnath Singh during Army Day celebrations.
- Historic Sites Covered: Battlefields from the 1962, 1971, and 1999 (Kargil) wars.
- Special Access: Includes Siachen Base Camp and the Galwan clash site (2020) for tourists.

# 22. Bharat Mobility Global Expo 2025 (PIB)






- Event: Bharat Mobility Global Expo 2025 held in New Delhi, India.



- Zonal Offices: Guwahati and Jammu.
- Mandate: Investigates offences affecting:
  - Sovereignty, security, and integrity of India.
  - o Friendly relations with foreign states.
  - Other offences specified in the **Schedule to the NIA Act, 2008**.

# 28. Parlay



### In News:

The Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO) will feature Pralay, an indigenous short-range



quasi-ballistic missile, in the **Republic Day parade** in New Delhi. Designed for use by the **Army** and **Air Force**, Pralay is India's first ballistic missile intended for **conventional strikes**.

# **Key Features of Pralay:**

- Range: 400 kilometers.
- Adds to the existing missile systems like BrahMos and Parahar, providing India with options for stand-off missile strikes across the border.
- Designed for deployment along the Line of Control (LoC) and the Line of Actual Control(LAC).

# **Defence Acquisition Council (DAC) Approval:**

- In 2023, the **DAC approved** the procurement of Pralay missiles (range: 400 km) and Nirbhay long-range subsonic cruise missiles (range: 1,000 km).
- A few hundred missiles were approved for procurement, enhancing India's long-range conventional strike capability.

### In News:

# **Celebration Highlights:**

- Focus: 75 years of the Constitution's enactment and Jan Bhagidari (people's participation).
- Theme: "Swarnim Bharat: Virasat aur Vikas" (Golden India: Heritage and Development).

- Chief Guest: Indonesian President Prabowo Subjanto.



# **Cultural and Historical Highlights:**

- Tableaux marking:

# 30. Uniform Civil Code (UCC)



### In News:

# **Uttarakhand – Uniform Civil Code (UCC) Implementation:**

- First in India: Uttarakhand became the first state to implement the UCC after Independence.
- Applicability: Applies to all residents except:
  - Scheduled Tribes
  - Natives who have migrated out of the state
- Banned Practices: Prohibits halala, iddat, and talaq from Muslim Personal Law.
- Women's Rights: Grants equal property and inheritance rights to women.
- **Registration Requirement:** Mandates **online registration** of marriages, divorces, and live-in relationships via the government portal **ucc.uk.gov.in**.

# **Deadlines for Registrations (Uttarakhand UCC):**

- Marriages since March 26, 2010: Must be registered within 6 months.
- Marriages post-UCC implementation: Must be registered within 60 days.
- Live-in relationships (past or present): Must be registered within 1 month of UCC implementation.
- Emergency Registrations: *Tatkal* facility available with a **nominal fee**.

# **Live-in Relationship Provisions:**

- Either partner can end the relationship **online or offline**.
- If only one partner applies, **confirmation** from the other is required.
- **Pregnancy Clause:** Government must be notified within **30 days** of childbirth if pregnancy occurs during the live-in relationship.
- Housing Rights: Landlords cannot deny housing to registered live-in couples.


# Uniform Civil Code (UCC) - Overview:

• **Definition:** A single set of laws governing personal matters — marriage, divorce, adoption, inheritance, and succession — for **all citizens**.



- Constitutional Reference: Mentioned in Article 44 of the Indian Constitution as a Directive Principle
  of State Policy.
- Nature: Not legally enforceable; serves as a guiding principle for the state.

# 31. PM Surya Ghar – Muft Bijli Yojana:



### In News:

- The union cabinet approved the Rs 75,000 crore PM Surya Ghar—Muft Bijli Yojana to benefit 1 crore families in February 2024.
- Ministry of New and Renewable Energy
- Implementing Agency: National level (NPIA) and State level (SIAs)

### Two Models for Solar Installation:


- RESCO (Renewable Energy Service Company) Model:
  - Third-party investors install rooftop solar systems.
  - Consumers pay only for the electricity used, with no upfront cost.
  - Surplus power can be sold to DISCOMs.
- Utility Led Aggregation (ULA) Model:
  - o DISCOMs or state-designated agencies set up rooftop solar systems for residential homes.

# **Subsidy Details:**

- Up to 2 kW: 60% of the unit cost covered.
- 2-3 kW: 40% of the unit cost covered.
- Capacity Cap: Subsidy available for a maximum of 3 kW.
- Subsidy Amounts:
  - ₹30,000 for 1 kW systems
  - ₹60,000 for 2 kW systems
  - ₹78,000 for 3 kW or higher systems



# 32. World Busiest Airport Report



### In News:

World's Busiest Airports (2024):

- Dubai International Airport:
  - Recorded 92.3 million passengers.
  - Ranked world's busiest for international travel.
- Atlanta Hartsfield-Jackson International Airport (ATL):
  - Second place with 4.6 million seats.
- Tokyo International Airport (HND):
  - Third place with 4.2 million seats.

Delhi Airport (DEL) recorded the largest capacity growth in February 2025 compared to February 2024, with seats rising 3.4% to 3.6 million.

It climbed to eighth place globally — up one position from January 2025 and up two positions from February 2024.
